

**DECLARATION  
OF THE WORLD PUBLIC ASSEMBLY  
"New World of Conscious Unity"**

**Preamble**

We, the participants of the First World Public Assembly, representing the peoples of the world, civil society, government structures, business, science, culture and spiritual traditions, are representatives from 153 countries gathered in Moscow on September 20-21, 2025:

realizing the depth of the global challenges of our time,  
recognizing the need for solidarity in the face of threats to the peaceful development of mankind,  
guided by the idea of conscious unity as the foundation for a sustainable and just future,

sharing a vision of the most acute problems of our time related to the conflict of generations, the gap in the transmission of traditional values and the need to form a responsible attitude towards the future of children and youth,

taking into account the recommendations and outcomes of all thematic platforms of the Assembly,

**note that:**

at the present stage of human development, when the World is losing its stability, security and predictability, global problems acquire special importance. They require urgent understanding of the conceptual and practical characteristics that have developed from different areas of the socio-cultural dynamics of human civilization, which carries not only the possibility of development, but also the risks of its self-destruction.

The current global situation is characterized by a sharp increase in geopolitical, economic and humanitarian challenges. Disunity between states intensifying, trust deficits are growing, and competition between value systems and development models is escalating.

In these circumstances, the role of public diplomacy, humanitarian cooperation, and public and cultural initiatives that can offer an alternative architecture for peaceful coexistence is of particular importance.

Increased interest in this issue is associated with the need to develop and adopt strategic development models, discuss the global agenda and new protocols for interaction between representatives of civil society and informal cultural and scientific diplomacy, political leaders, ministers, journalists, public opinion authorities, youth and religious organizations and business.

Realizing the importance of evidence-based dialogue platforms for the formation of preventive security measures and the prevention of local and global conflicts, the participants of the World Assembly emphasized the need to comprehend and adopt

common universals and imperatives of development aimed at preserving and subjectivity of man, peoples and all mankind.

Strategic resources and regulators of development, such as spiritual and humanitarian values and the meanings of civilizational unity and diversity, were considered as the main factors in the formation of security and sustainability of self-developing systems at the conceptual level.

In this regard, it was noted that the current unipolar world is developing uncontrollably and by the type of colonial dependence in a forceful manner, violating their subjectivity and the sovereignty of their peoples' cultures as subjects of the historical process. Having reached its highest integrity and complexity, human civilization requires other management models, the complexity of which must correspond to its complexity and diversity, because the simple cannot control the complex.

The World Assembly emphasized that the answers to the acute contradictions of the "uncontrollable complexity" of the reality of the modern world lie in the humanitarian sphere and require a strategic understanding of them in the areas of the implementation of the processes of humanitarian modernization and humanitarian security, and on their basis the formation of the imperative of civilizational development in order to achieve conscious unity of mankind both in understanding the goals of development and ways to achieve them.

The key goal is to achieve a synergy of holistic diversity, in which naturally formed ways, images and lifestyles do not just coexist, but mutually enrich and enhance each other.

The highest task of reforming the modern world agenda and the existing world order should be the restoration of the main vector aimed at Man, the development of his personal potential, in all the details of his interactions with nature and society, with the priority of learning the truth based on the principles of morality and humanism as the foundations of the solidary development of civilization and understanding man as the main subject of civilization and the guarantor the existence of human life on Earth.

The participants of the World Assembly came to a consolidated conclusion: the imperatives of humanitarian modernization, necessary for sustainable, harmonious and secure development, require integration at all levels — from national policies and legislation to international treaties and regulations. This necessity leads to the formation of a new social contract that meets the challenges of the time.

A special role in this process should be played by the development of socio-cultural dynamics and scientific and humanitarian cooperation, which create a key opportunity for:

- convergence of national approaches to sustainable development and the indivisible security of mankind;

- formation of a new value-based approach to the world;

- the creation of a universal cultural potential based on it, capable of restoring continuity and guaranteeing the development of a civilization with a human face.

The key practical condition for this is to promote the preservation and involvement in the cultural interpenetration of monuments of the world spiritual heritage.

## **And we proclaim this Declaration:**

### **1. Fundamental principles of a New World**

The priority of human dignity over political, economic and ideological interests  
 Joint responsibility to future generations for the preservation of the planet and the continuity of civilizational development

Justice, involving an equitable distribution of benefits and costs of global progress

Unity in the diversity of cultures, traditions and civilizations

Solidarity as a response to global challenges

Dialogue as the main conflict resolution tool

Responsibility to future generations.

### **2. Key areas (based on the results of the thematic platforms)**

#### **2.1. Public diplomacy and peace**

Creation of an international Public Diplomacy Platform for the coordination of humanitarian initiatives.

Support for conflict de-escalation projects through culture, education, and interreligious dialogue.

The development of institutions of public diplomacy and their close coordination with other forms of diplomacy to achieve the common good.

#### **2.2. Economics and Social Responsibility**

Development and promotion of international ethical codes for business and social investments.

Development of solidarity funding mechanisms for development.

Creation of digital ecosystems of economic cooperation.

#### **2.3. Science and Technology**

Establishing a moratorium on the use of AI for military purposes and developing ethical standards for digital technologies

Promoting open access to scientific knowledge and technology through international databases.

#### **2.4. Culture and education**

Launch of the Cultural Bridge International program to preserve heritage and support intercultural exchanges

Creation of a Global Digital Library of knowledge of the World Peoples Assembly with materials in the languages of the United Nations

Adoption and assistance in the implementation of the Memorandum "On the Value of Monuments of the World Spiritual Heritage".

Formation of institutions, technologies and best practices for involving objects of spiritual heritage in cultural and economic turnover

#### **2.5. Youth Policy**

Expansion of the activities of the Youth World Peoples Assembly.

Support for startups in social entrepreneurship through a system of grants and mentoring programs.

Contributing to the implementation of the UN initiative on the formation of the Youth Laboratory of the Future.

Holding a Youth Summit and an International Children's Congress in preparation for the future World Assembly.

## 2.6. Interdisciplinary Research

Expansion of the activities of the International Scientific and Expert Council of the World Peoples Assembly for the study of civilizational processes with the participation of experts from the United Nations, SCO, BRICS, CIS, etc., including the establishment of a Youth Section of the Scientific and Expert Council.

Launching research programs on humanitarian modernization.

## 3. Implementation mechanisms

Annual monitoring of the implementation of the Declaration's provisions.

Creation of working groups in each area with the participation of representatives from different countries.

Publish open progress reports to ensure transparency.

Integration of recommendations into the programs of the United Nations, UNESCO, SCO, BRICS and other international structures.

Promoting the formation of institutions, technologies and practices for the actualization of national resources and the realization of the potential of solidary civilizational development.

Organization of transnational stock bureaus for solidarity development resources.

## 4. Addressing the world

We call on nations, governments, businesses, and civil society:

To abandon the rhetoric of hostility and confrontation.

Invest in projects that strengthen trust and cooperation.

To support initiatives aimed at achieving conscious unity.

## Conclusion

The participants of the First World Public Assembly, guided by the spirit of solidarity and shared responsibility, declare that:

On the principles of the New World:

They are confident that it is possible to build a stable system of international relations only on the basis of equality, respect for sovereignty, and spiritual and moral foundations. It is these values that make up the essence of the concept of "New World of Conscious Unity," where unity is not a declaration, but a practical diplomacy of everyday life.

On the fundamentals of global development:

They recognize culture and spirituality as strategic resources of international stability and define the moral and humanitarian foundation as the core of the new global order. Special emphasis was placed on the critical importance of strategic thinking, public dialogue and clear moral guidelines in the activities of international humanitarian alliances.

On responsibility and the future:

They agreed that everyone's responsibility for the shared future is reflected in the understanding that every action, word and idea affect the climate of trust, security and universal development. The future is in the hands of humanity itself, and despite all our differences, we have one common denominator: humanity.

On the way forward:

They realize that the peoples of the world have a long way to go towards genuine conscious unity. This is a path of effort, patience, dialogue, courage, empathy and faith in the noble goal of creating a multipolar world where respect and dignity prevail, and justice and trust become the basis of relations.

Participants of the World Assembly:

declared their determination to be different, but not divided, affirming diversity as the basis of the true unity of humanity.

called on the world to hear a single Voice of Reason proclaiming that the true power of unity is measured not by dominance, but by the ability to serve humanity.

have approved the Manifesto of Conscious Unity, a worldview that unites nations; the Charter of the New World, a foundation for joint action and development of initiatives; the Declaration on Happiness, a guideline for humanitarian development.

have declared the World Public Assembly to be the center of humanitarian diplomacy, where peoples, cultures and generations consciously shape a common future.

Participants of the World Assembly:

fully support the central theme of the 80th anniversary session of the UN General Assembly - "Working together: 80 years of joint work for peace, development and human rights and the way forward."

express their readiness to contribute to the efforts of the United Nations to strengthen multilateral dialogue and partnership

confirm their interest in developing comprehensive cooperation between the United Nations and the World Peoples Assembly

propose to jointly consider specific formats of cooperation with relevant UN structures.

This Declaration reflects the collective will of the participants to build a world where conscious unity, justice and respect for diversity become the secure foundation of global development.
