## I. MAIN ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE WORLD PEOPLES ASSEMBLY

### 2025

Since its foundation in 2017 as the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly, aimed at uniting countries of the Eurasian space, the organization has undergone significant development. In 2024, reflecting the expansion of cooperation with African nations, it was transformed into the Eurasian and African Peoples' Assembly. In 2025, relying on the accumulated experience and a broad circle of international partners, the Assembly reached a new level and was transformed into the World Peoples' Assembly.

The World Peoples Assembly is an international union of non-governmental organizations and active citizens, it operates on the basis of spiritual and moral values, solidarity, and responsibility for the common future, in the interests of strengthening the unity of peoples, harmonious coexistence, and cooperation in the world of diversity.

As at the end of the reporting period, the Assembly's members comprise **1,192** individuals and **94** legal entities, representatives of non-governmental organizations from **71** countries. In 2025, **132** new members from **22** countries joined the Assembly.

On May 28, 2025, a landmark **meeting of the General Assembly – the Supreme Body of the Assembly** – was held. A key topic of the agenda was one of the most important moments defining the current vector of development and expansion of international relations. By decision of the General Assembly (the General Meeting of the Assembly's members), the organization officially adopted its new name that reflects its strategic priorities – **The World Peoples' Assembly**.

In addition to changing the Assembly's name, a number of other matters were brought before the agenda of the General Meeting, such as: reviewing the results of the Assembly's activities over the past 4 years; approving a development strategy and a forward-looking plan for the next 5 years; approving a new version of the Assembly's Charter; the elections for the positions of Secretary-General, Chairman of the General Council, members of the General Council and members and Co-Chairmen of the Supreme Advisory Council.

Between sessions of the General Assembly, the collegial executive body responsible for implementing the Assembly's objectives is **the General Council**. The General Council of the Assembly includes prominent public figures from **8** countries worldwide.

During the reporting period, three meetings of the General Council were held. The agenda items discussed included: organizing the report-and-election General Assembly; preparations for the First World Public Assembly "A New World of Conscious Unity"; establishing the World Public Recognition Prize for Service to Humanity; holding the "Trust and Unity" Competition for grants from the International Union of Non-Governmental Organizations "The World Peoples' Assembly"; matters concerning the Coordinating Council of the Youth The World Peoples Assembly and the Assembly's new specialized councils; opportunities for expanding partnerships with international organizations; current operational tasks for the Assembly's structural units.

The new composition of the **Assembly's Supreme Advisory Council**, its highest representative and advisory body, includes esteemed international public, political, and state figures, as well as representatives from business, industrial, financial circles and the media from **45** countries.

Among the Assembly's priority organizational tasks is the ongoing process of establishing its **Representative Offices**. In 2025, new Representative Offices of the World Peoples' Assembly were opened in the Kingdom of Bahrain and Hyderabad (India). In total, the Assembly now has **14** Representative Offices.

The Assembly serves as a platform for **25 Specialized Councils**. Their focus areas include scientific, economic, and cultural cooperation, as well as challenges in the fields of education and sports. The work of these specialized councils is carried out by representatives from various countries, ensuring broad public support and engagement from the Assembly's participants.

In 2025, the Assembly concluded **44 cooperation agreements** with partners from **21** countries. Overall, since its establishment, the Assembly has signed **300** agreements with business organizations, chambers of commerce and industry, higher education institutions, foundations, research centers, and various public organizations and associations from **53** countries.

In accordance with the approved Development Strategy of the Assembly for 2025-2030, the following **Priority Areas** were actively pursued during the reporting period:

- Strategic Partnership and Public Diplomacy – expanding the space for trust and constructive dialogue.
- The Unifying Power of Culture – preserving and developing cultural diversity as a key factor for humanity's stable development.
- Education of the Future – developing international educational partnership.
- Sustainable Development – ensuring environmental, technological, and food security through humanitarian interaction.
- Culture of Memory – preserving the history of the past as a foundation for identity and solidarity.
- New Generation of Peace – engaging youth in peacemaking, civic participation, and international cooperation.
- Happiness Diplomacy – strengthening the social and spiritual foundations of well-being.
- Business Cooperation – humanizing economic processes and developing ethical business diplomacy.
- Media and Digital Diplomacy – promoting the values of peace through digital communication and fostering information sovereignty.

### **World Public Assembly**

The central focus of the Assembly's work in 2025 was the organization of the First World Public Assembly "A New World of Conscious Unity". The event took place on September 20-21, 2025, in Moscow, the capital of the Russian Federation, and was timed to coincide with the International Day of Peace established by the UN.

The World Assembly brought together over **4,500** participants from **153** countries, including prominent public figures, politicians, diplomats, scientists, as well as representatives of culture, education, business, traditional religions, and leading global media.

The initiator and organizer of the World Assembly was the International Union of Non-Governmental Organizations “The World Peoples’ Assembly”.

The World Public Assembly established a new format for humanitarian dialogue, based on uniting efforts in the name of peace, development, and the conscious unity of peoples. It became a practical platform for addressing contemporary challenges through partnership and constructive action.

The central event was the Plenary Session, which set the value-driven tone for the entire discussion.

The extensive program of the First World Public Assembly featured over 40 thematic sessions spanning a wide range of fields, including culture, science and education, socially oriented business, outer space, interreligious dialogue, family, youth, sports, tourism, media, and others.

Key thematic tracks:

- Strategic partnership and public diplomacy
- Humanitarian modernization: human as the center of the future
- Values of the new world
- Spiritual and cultural unity and service to values
- Responsibility as strategic category of the humanity development

The program included 7 panel discussions: The Business Forum “Social Responsibility of Business: Investing in the Future”, the Media Forum “Media in the Service of Humanity”, the International Youth Forum “Generation of Unity”, and the International Public Forum “Victorious Nations: Lessons of the Second World War and Responsibility for Peace”.

More than 70 cooperation agreements with international organizations were signed.

Exhibitions were organized, as well as a cultural program for all Assembly participants.

For the first time, the World Public Assembly hosted **the inaugural ceremony of the “For Service to Humanity” World Public Recognition Prize**. The award was established by the World Peoples Assembly and it is presented for exceptional contribution to strengthening peace among nations, developing humanitarian cooperation, and selfless service to the ideals of humanity.

The award ceremony for the laureates of **the IV International Contest “Leader of People’s Diplomacy – 2025”** was held.

In total, the contest received over 150 applications from 42 countries.

The finalists were leaders from 15 countries: India, Indonesia, Spain, Italy, Kazakhstan, Cameroon, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Poland, Russia, Tajikistan, Tunisia, France, South Africa, and Japan.

Certificates were presented to the winners of the **“Trust and Unity” Contest** for grants from the International Union of Non-Governmental Organizations “World Peoples Assembly”. The winners of the competition, designed to develop international projects in the field of public diplomacy, were 7 projects from Russian non-profit organizations. These projects will be implemented in partnership with non-profit organizations from 21 countries.

The results of the collaborative work, open dialogue, and deep reflection were the adopted final documents, reflecting the key ideas and values of the World Public Assembly:

The Manifesto of Conscious Unity – an expression of the unifying worldview foundation for peoples in their diversity;

The Charter for a New World – a foundation for future interaction, joint actions, and the development of initiatives;

The Declaration on Happiness;

The Declaration of the World Public Assembly.

Media coverage of the First World Public Assembly:

The total cumulative audience reach exceeded 130 million users worldwide.

Participants of the World Assembly expressed confidence that only on the basis of equality, respect for sovereignty, and spiritual and moral foundations a sustainable system of international relations can be built, encapsulating these principles in the concept of a “New World of Conscious Unity”.

The modern multipolar idea represents today that new form where partnership and cooperation among nations suppose a deeper degree of trust, resilience in a broad sphere of interconnections, the unification of potentials, and the creation of common institutions.

The World Assembly, as a Global Public Summit, will be held annually in different countries of the world.

Preparations for the Second World Assembly have already begun. It is scheduled to take place in September 2026.

The World Assembly has become a space where words turn into actions, and dialogue becomes a strategic resource for humanity in the 21st century.

### **Interaction with International Organizations**

During the reporting period, the Assembly carried out planned work on interaction with international intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations.

International representative meetings and official visits of the Assembly's delegations took place in Turkmenistan, India, China, Bahrain, Egypt, and Iraq.

The Assembly's office was visited by representatives and delegations from Angola, The Gambia, the Republic of Madagascar, Ghana, Brazil, and Serbia.

Significant attention was paid to promoting the diplomatic role of non-governmental organizations in the context of a forming multipolar world, and to shaping a consolidated opinion both in interaction with governmental bodies of various countries and through **cooperation with integration associations**.

During a visit to the People's Republic of China, the Chairwoman of the General Council of the World Peoples' Assembly, Ms. Svetlana Smirnova, held a meeting with the Chinese Committee for SCO Good-Neighborliness, Friendship and Cooperation.

With the support of the Russian Federation Commission for UNESCO, the World Peoples Assembly held an international round table named "The UNESCO Project: Uniting Humanity for Common Values and Collective Efforts to Build a Better Future". The discussion included representatives of international intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, experts in the fields of education, science, culture, and communication, as well as representatives of universities from different countries.

The Assembly participated in the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) Youth Forum, "Youth at the Forefront: Supporting Science and Social Integration for Sustainable Development", held at the UN Headquarters in New York. The World Peoples Assembly was represented at the forum by Ms. Alana Kochieva, Head of the Directorate for International Education Development and Partnership.

The activities of the World Peoples Assembly were presented by the Co-Chair of its Supreme Advisory Council, Ms. Alexandra Ochirova, at a meeting of Goodwill Ambassadors at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris. The event brought together UNESCO Goodwill Ambassadors, Special Envoys, and Artists for Peace representing all continents of the planet.

Within the framework of the World Public Assembly "A New World of Conscious Unity", a Panel Session "The Commonwealth of Independent States: Conscious Unity" was organized. The session discussed issues related to the activities, challenges, and development prospects of the CIS.

A delegation of the World Peoples' Assembly, headed by Secretary-General Mr. Andrey Belyaninov, took part in the historic international event – the 43rd Session of the UNESCO General Conference, held in the ancient city of Samarkand. The UNESCO General Conference elected a new Director-General of the Organization – distinguished Egyptian Egyptologist, and Egypt's former Minister of Tourism and Antiquities, Khaled El-Enany.

As part of the World Public Assembly, a Panel Discussion "BRICS Dialogue and Partnership for Strengthening Solidarity and International Cooperation" was held with the participation of the BRICS International Development Organization.

### **Scientific, Educational Activities and Business Cooperation**

The core activities of all the Assembly's structural units were dedicated to the further development of instruments for cultural-humanitarian, scientific-educational, and business diplomacy, as well as youth cooperation. The endorsement of expert diplomacy received a new momentum.

**Meetings of the Scientific and Expert Council** of the World Peoples Assembly on the topic of “Global Challenges for the Preservation and Development of Humanity” were held as part of the First World Public Assembly. The meeting was attended by experts and public figures from 20 countries, including Hungary, Guinea, Malaysia, Myanmar, Serbia, Tajikistan, India, China, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Russia, France, and South Africa. Initiatives requiring the deployment of international scientific and expert cooperation under the auspices of the World Peoples Assembly were proposed and approved. A set of priority themes was defined, which will serve as a guideline and foundation for creating globally significant intellectual products aimed at strengthening mutual understanding, trust, and cooperation.

**Within the framework of scientific and educational cooperation** during the reporting period, events were implemented aimed at developing partnership relations with international organizations of the UN, UNESCO, FAO, the Alliance of Civilizations, the Union of Arab Universities, and the Association of Soviet and Russian Universities in various countries.

The international round table “International Cooperation: Science and Education. A Meeting of University Rectors”, organized by the World Peoples Assembly jointly with the Union of Arab Universities, was held as part of the World Public Assembly. The event was attended by heads of leading universities and representatives of international organizations from the countries of the Middle East, North Africa, Asia, Latin America, and the EAEU.

Also, on the platform of the World Assembly, a discussion “International Scientific and Educational Cooperation as a Factor of Sustainable Development” took place. The key idea of the meeting was to reaffirm the role of science and education as a fundamental mechanism for sustainable development, public diplomacy, and building trust in the context of increasing fragmentation of the global agenda.

As part of the World Public Assembly, a panel session “Humanitarian Modernization – an Imperative for the Development of Modern Civilization” was held, organized by the International Union of Non-Governmental Organizations “World Peoples’ Assembly”. The focus of the discussion was centered on the challenges of forming a multipolar world and the role of humanitarian modernization as a key condition for sustainable development.

A substantive and important event was the panel session “Meaning as a Strategic Resource for the Development of the Individual, Society, and the State”, organized by the International Union of Non-Governmental “World Peoples’ Assembly”. The discussion included representatives of international intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations, experts in the fields of education, science, culture, and communication, as well as representatives of scientific and educational institutions from Russia, Europe, Asia, and Latin America.

The International Conference “Humanitarian Modernization – an Imperative of a Multidimensional World” was held, dedicated to issues of humanitarian development, international cooperation, and a sustainable future. It became an important platform for the exchange of experience between experts, public figures, and representatives of the scientific community.

The Assembly acted as the organizer of the International Museum-University Festival “To the Museum Today, To Science Tomorrow”. The festival is held with the aim of attracting youth's attention to scientific research.

An international interactive conversation “Eco-Habits: The Past and Present Are Closer Than They Seem” was held at the BRICS+ Media Center.

The International Forum “The Health Preservation Industry in Greater Eurasia” took place. The Forum was attended by representatives of business circles from China, India, Afghanistan, Serbia, Moldova, Vietnam, and Kazakhstan.

Within the educational program of the World Peoples’ Assembly, a successful series of lectures by the University of Public Diplomacy was implemented, aimed at developing competencies in the field of international and humanitarian projects.

A number of events were held aimed at maintaining international dialogue on **business cooperation** issues.

A notable event of 2025 was the International Business Forum “Social Responsibility of Business: Investment in the Future” as part of the World Public Assembly, with participants from 21 countries. In the modern era of global change, corporate social responsibility is becoming a key factor for sustainable development and international cooperation. The Forum’s program included panel sessions: “From People’s Trust to Economies’ Trust: Humanitarian Foundations of International Partnership”, “The Role of Business in Economic Integration Amid Global Changes in the World”, and “The International Business Ecosystem: Project Presentations”.

World Peoples Assembly participated in the XVI International Economic Forum “Russia – Islamic World: KazanForum 2025”, where it held its own session: “Towards the World Public Assembly. The Role of Public Diplomacy in Strengthening Friendship and Cooperation Among Peoples”.

By invitation from the Interparliamentary Assembly of Member Nations of the Commonwealth of Independent States (CIS), the Assembly of the Peoples of the World took part in the International Tourism Forum Travel HUB “Commonwealth” – 2025 in the Dagestan Republic.

The Assembly is an annual participant in the International Municipal Forum BRICS +. In 2025, as part of the forum, the Assembly organized and conducted a Round Table “International Tourism: Cooperation and Development”.

As part of the World Public Assembly, a Panel Discussion “International Tourism in a Multipolar World” was held.

### **Cultural and Humanitarian Activities, Youth Cooperation**

A key priority for the Assembly remains: working with youth, promoting a humanitarian strategy for the community of peoples, based on respectful attitudes towards shared history, spiritual and moral values, the mutual enrichment of different cultures, and the pursuit of joint development.

An important task of the year was strengthening the role and authority of the Assembly as a significant institution of people's diplomacy, advancing ideas of humanism, **intercultural partnership and preservation of spiritual heritage**.

As part of the World Public Assembly, there was organized work across 10 thematic platforms focusing on preserving cultural diversity and the intangible heritage of peoples.

These included: Panel Session “Spiritual Culture – A Space for Shaping Meanings and Values”, Round Table “Altai – A Junction of Civilizational Worlds”, Interactive Platform “Ancestral Culture: Family-Clan-People-Human Race”, Round Table “Interreligious Dialogue for the Preservation and Strengthening of Spiritual and Moral Values”, Panel Session “Spiritual Unity in the Name of Peace and Humanity”. The second Congress of the World Organization of Writers (WOW) was held for two days.

In the Grand Hall of the Central House of Writers, the World Organization of Writers and the World Peoples Assembly celebrated the 26th UNESCO World Poetry Day.

On the World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development, a round table “Unity in Diversity” was held at the Assembly’s office.

The official opening of the International Artists Festival in Manama took place, with participating artists from 27 countries worldwide.

Within the framework of the World Public Assembly “A New World of Conscious Unity”, a Round Table “Traditions as a Resource for the Future” was organized. The discussion focused on the role of crafts in regional development, as well as approaches and methods for implementing socio-cultural practices in territories. The international creative campaign “Belt of Peace” was presented.

Support continued for the International Art Project “Angels of Peace”, the Eurasian High Fashion National Costume Competition “ETHNO ERATO”, and the project “Weddings of the Peoples of the World”.

**The historical memory preservation project “Immortal Memory”** continued in 2025 to implement its strategy of actively incorporating modern communication and educational formats aimed at popularizing the memory of the Great Patriotic War. Particular attention was paid to digital platforms, multimedia projects, and interactive exhibitions, enabling outreach to a wider audience, including youth. All initiatives were synchronized with the anniversary date – the 80th anniversary of the Great Victory.

Marking the anniversary of the historic meeting at the Elbe River, the traditional International Public Forum “Spirit of the Elbe” was held. It was attended by representatives from Russia, the USA, Canada, Western and Eastern Europe, and countries-former republics of the Soviet Union that were victorious in World War II.

The International Public Forum of the Anti-Hitler Coalition Countries, “Victorious Nations: The Lesson of World War II and Responsibility for Peace”, held as part of the First World Public Assembly, gathered participants from over 30 countries worldwide.

A landmark event was the 20th International Film Festival “Common Victory” named after Vladimir Menshov. The festival consolidates filmmakers from around the world who stand for historical truth and defend it in their work. Applications for participation were received from 56 countries. The festival features four competitions: Documentary, National, TV and Streaming, and Student, showcasing the full spectrum of contemporary documentary cinema formats. Films were judged by professional juries, including renowned film and television figures from Russia, China, Italy, Belarus, Sweden, and Brazil.

The Film Marathon “Common Victory” became an integral part of the International Film Festival “Common Victory” and has evolved into a year-round, continuous event.

The main outcome of the **Assembly’s project “There is Happiness”** was the signing of a unique document – the “Declaration on Happiness” – at the First World Public Assembly.

Within the World Public Assembly, the following were conducted: an International Round Table “The Digital Environment in the Family and the Family in the Digital Environment”, an International Round Table “Diplomacy of Happiness: International Practice for Building the Future” and a Special Issue of the magazine “Happiness Aggregator” was published.

The International Exhibition “The World Draws Happiness” brought together representatives from 150 countries and attracted the attention of over 5,000 participants.

The International Campaign “Letters of Happiness” became a unique platform uniting creativity and good wishes from representatives of diverse peoples across the planet. The campaign involved sending postcards with drawings created by children and professional artists from 46 countries worldwide, who were the participants of the International Festival “The World Draws Happiness”.

The Assembly's project “Children of Eurasia”, aimed at the social and creative development of children, expanding opportunities for their future self-realization, and activating people’s diplomacy through establishing personal contacts among children, continued its development with the annual festival “Sunflower”.

In 2025, a key result of the activities of the World Peoples’ Youth Assembly was the successful hosting of the International Youth Forum “Generation of Unity”, which united representatives of youth organizations and public movements from over 25 countries.

The forum featured strategic sessions: “The Future of Diplomacy: The Role of Youth and Social Responsibility”; “Digital Media and Information Literacy: The Individual, Society, AI”; “Education and Science – New Horizons of the Development”; “Culture and Interethnic Dialogue – Bridges Between Generations”.

The Youth Forum became a vital part of the World Public Assembly “A New World of Conscious Unity”.

An important area of work was the formation of a large, multifunctional volunteer team numbering about 300 people.

A Business Game: “CIS Model: Humanitarian Cooperation Through the Eyes of Youth” was organized, with its sessions held in the Republic of Uzbekistan and at the Civic Chamber of the Russian Federation.

The World Peoples Assembly is actively establishing itself as an international platform that shapes the ideology of peace and benevolent good-neighborliness among different countries and peoples.

During the reporting period, interaction with partners from the Arab world, Africa, and Latin America saw particular intensification.

Overall, in 2025, the Assembly held over **430** events, with representatives from more than **153** countries participating in offline and online formats.

The World Peoples Assembly is an international partnership founded on the principles of conscious unity, respect for the moral ideals and cultural values of peoples, and shared responsibility for the future of humanity.

## II. GENERAL ASSEMBLY, MEETINGS OF THE GENERAL COUNCIL AND SUPREME ADVISORY COUNCIL

**May 28, Russia, Moscow**



The reporting and election meeting of the international union of non—governmental organizations - the Eurasian and African Peoples Assembly took place; it made a historic decision: the organization received a new name — the World Peoples Assembly. The General Assembly was attended by more than 60 countries: members of the Assembly, heads of representative offices, diplomats,

parliamentarians, scientists, public figures, cultural figures and spiritual leaders. The agenda of the General Meeting also included a summing up of the Assembly's activities over the past 4 years; a development strategy and a long-term plan for the next 5 years were approved; a new version of the Assembly's Charter was approved; elections of the Secretary General, Chairperson of the General Council, members of the General Council, members and Co-Chairs of the Supreme Advisory Council were held.



**Four meetings of the General Council were held during the reporting period (April 23, June 26, September 1, December 15).** The meetings discussed such issues as: the holding of the reporting and election General Assembly, the preparation of the First World Public Assembly "New World of Conscious Unity", the establishment of the World Public Recognition Award "For Service to

Humanity", the holding of the Contest "Trust and Unity" for grants from the International Union of Non-Governmental Organizations "World Peoples Assembly", on the Coordinating Council of the Youth World Peoples Assembly and new specialized councils of the Assembly, opportunities for expanding partnership with international organizations, current tasks of the Assembly's structural units.

On December 15, at the last meeting of the General Council this year, the results of the outgoing year were summed up and work plans for 2026 were discussed. Also, the issue of establishing the institute of Assembly Ambassadors was also considered. The purpose of introducing the status of Ambassadors is to promote the mission of the Assembly, develop comprehensive cooperation with international organizations, and expand the number of supporters of the Assembly in different countries of the world.

The members of the General Council approved the Concept for the Development of the Assembly's Representative Offices and the Concept for the Development of the Youth World Peoples Assembly for 2026-2030, considered the establishment of new specialized councils and the approval of new versions of the Regulations on the Scientific and Expert Council of the Assembly, on the Coordinating Committee of Specialized Councils and the Coordinating Committee of the Assembly's Representative Offices.



**Two meetings of the Assembly's Supreme Advisory Council (June 24 and December 15) were held.**

The new Supreme Advisory Council of the Assembly is the highest representative and advisory body, includes reputable international public, political and government figures, representatives of business, industrial and financial circles, and the media from 45 countries. At the

first meeting, the Council members discussed the main activities and tasks of the Supreme Advisory Council of the World Peoples Assembly for 2025-2030.

Following the results of the second meeting, it was decided to support the holding of the Second World Public Summit in September 2026 as a new international public communication platform. The leading theme of the year has been determined: "New World: Values that Unite." A series of Regional Global Public Summits was also supported.

The members of the Supreme Advisory Council discussed issues of cooperation with international organizations such as the United Nations, ECOSOC, FAO, UNESCO, UN-HABITAT, SCO, BRICS, AU, LAS and others. In 2026, relations with these organizations will reach a new level – this is one of the most important tasks of the year. It is also planned to sign a memorandum of cooperation with the CIS in the new year and hold a presentation of the World Peoples Assembly in the SCO.

The program included 7 panel discussions: The Business Forum “Social Responsibility of Business: Investing in the Future”, the Media Forum “Media in the Service of Humanity”, the International Youth Forum “Generation of Unity”, and the International Public Forum “Victorious Nations: Lessons of the Second World War and Responsibility for Peace”.



More than 70 cooperation agreements with international organizations were signed.



Exhibitions were organized, as well as a cultural program for all Assembly participants.

For the first time, the World Public Assembly hosted the **inaugural ceremony of the “For Service to Humanity” World Public Recognition Award.**



The award was established by the World Peoples’ Assembly and it is presented for exceptional contribution to strengthening peace among nations, developing humanitarian cooperation, and selfless service to the ideals of humanity.

The results of the collaborative work, open dialogue, and deep reflection were the adopted final documents, reflecting the key ideas and values of the World Public Assembly:

The Manifesto of Conscious Unity – an expression of the unifying worldview foundation for peoples in their diversity;

The Charter for a New World – a foundation for future interaction, joint actions, and the development of initiatives;

The Declaration on Happiness;

The Declaration of the World Public Assembly.

Media coverage of the First World Public Assembly:

The total cumulative audience reach exceeded 130 million users worldwide.

Participants of the World Assembly expressed confidence that only on the basis of equality, respect for sovereignty, and spiritual and moral foundations a sustainable system of international relations can be built, encapsulating these principles in the concept of a “New World of Conscious Unity”.

The modern multipolar idea represents today that new form where partnership and cooperation among nations suppose a deeper degree of trust, resilience in a broad sphere of interconnections, the unification of potentials, and the creation of common institutions.

The World Assembly, as a Global Public Summit, will be held annually in different countries of the world.

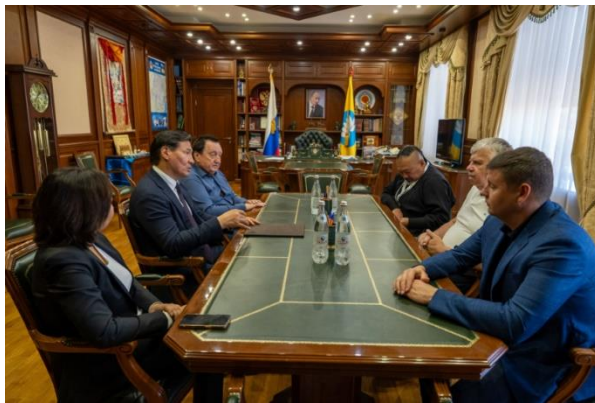

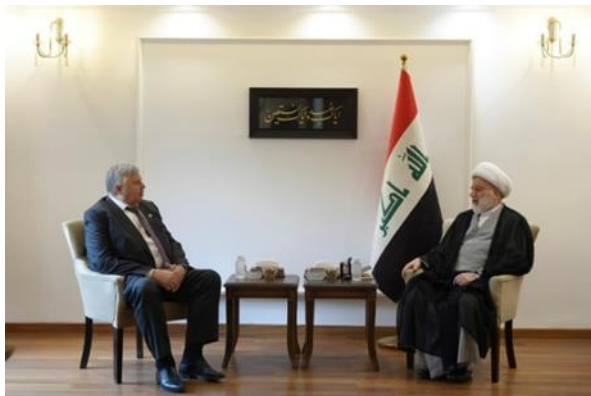

The delegation of the World Peoples Assembly held an official meeting with the Iraqi Union of Teachers, headed by the President of the organization, Uday Khattam Al-Isawi. The Union, which has more than 1,200,000 members, has been protecting the rights and interests of teachers for almost a century, playing a key role in the development of the country's education system. Special attention was paid to the idea of holding a forum for teachers from 22 countries. The importance of creating a permanent platform for the exchange of experience between teachers from different countries was emphasized. Following the meeting, the President of the Iraqi Union of Teachers, Uday Khattam Al-Isawi, confirmed his readiness to actively cooperate with the World Peoples Assembly in the educational field.

## December 10, Iraq, Baghdad



During the visit to Baghdad, a delegation of the World Peoples Assembly headed by Secretary General Andrei Belyaninov held a meeting with Sheikh Humam Hammoudi, head of the Supreme Islamic Council of Iraq (Shiite Movement in Iraq, a pro-Iranian organization). During the meeting, issues of interreligious interaction, spiritual unity and joint responsibility of religious leaders for strengthening peace and harmony were discussed. Special attention was paid to the preparation of the Arab Summit, during which it was proposed to hold an interfaith round table with the participation of spiritual leaders of different faiths.

The 11th Global Forum of the United Nations Alliance of Civilizations (UNAOC) was hosted by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in the city of Riyadh on 14-15 December 2025 under the overarching theme, “UNAOC: Two Decades of Dialogue for Humanity - Advancing a New Era of Mutual Respect and Understanding in a Multipolar World”. The World Peoples Assembly was represented at the forum by Alana Akhsarovna Kochieva, Head of the Department for International Education and Partnership.

**December 19, Russia, Moscow**

A working meeting between Adviser to the Secretary General Yasser Allaham and Jaziri Alqaf Abdullah Suffian, Senator, Member of the Parliament of Malaysia (2020-2023), took place at the office headquarters of the World Peoples Assembly.

## VI. PROJECTS OF THE PUBLIC DIPLOMACY

### *INTERNATIONAL CONTEST «LEADER OF PUBLIC DIPLOMACY»*

The Contest was established with the aim of forming an international community of socially active members of society, involving them in active international public activities, developing interaction and partnership, and exchanging best practices in the field of public diplomacy.

On April 16 - September 20, the IV International Contest "LEADER OF PUBLIC DIPLOMACY" was held.

The Contest was attended by representatives of non-governmental organizations implementing projects in the field of public diplomacy, who have experience in implementing projects in the field of public diplomacy as a leader.



In total, the competition received more than 150 applications from 42 countries. For the first time, past laureates from different countries acted as mentors, along with members of the International Organizing Committee. The preparation and coordination of the competition was carried out by the International Organizing Committee, which included 43 members from 22 countries.

The final of the competition was held on September 20 on the sidelines of the World Public Assembly.

The diplomas of the First-degree laureates were awarded from Indonesia, Lebanon, Russia, France, and Japan.

Diplomas of the Second-degree laureates were awarded from Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Poland, Russia, Tajikistan, Tunisia, and South Africa.

Diplomas of the Third-degree laureates were awarded from India, Spain, Italy, Cameroon, and Russia.

From July 1 to September 1, the stage of collecting applications and determining the winners of the first Trust and Unity competition for grants from the World Peoples Assembly was held. In total, 76 projects from organizations from more than 60 countries were submitted to the competition. The projects were evaluated by an Expert Council.



The Assembly of the Peoples of the World supported six international NGO projects in the field of children's diplomacy, education, international scientific cooperation, preservation of historical memory, development of creative practices, and formation of international leadership communities. The grant competition "Trust and Unity" is aimed at developing international partnership, strengthening intercultural

dialogue and promoting the values of public diplomacy.

**UNIVERSITY OF PUBLIC DIPLOMACY**

As part of the educational program of the World Peoples Assembly, a series of lectures by the University of Public Diplomacy aimed at developing competencies in the field of international and humanitarian projects was successfully held on November 10-21.

The audience was introduced to key aspects of public diplomacy that make it possible to effectively create and develop initiatives that strengthen dialogue between cultures and peoples. Two courses were held: "Leadership in international humanitarian projects" and "Project management in public diplomacy". The course participants are from Russia, Croatia, Bulgaria, Zambia, Azerbaijan, France, and Finland.

The University of Public Diplomacy will continue its work as an open educational platform of the World Peoples Assembly, uniting those who seek to develop international dialogue and promote peace.

### **May 14, Kazan, Russia**



As part of the XVI International Economic Forum "Russia – the Islamic World: KazanForum 2025", a session of the World Peoples Assembly "Towards the World Public Assembly. The session resulted in an exchange of views on the most pressing issues of public diplomacy at the present stage, a presentation and an invitation to participate in the World Public Assembly.

As part of the All–Russian Forum with International participation "Russia - the House of Peoples", the World Peoples Assembly acted as a partner in the preparation and holding of an expanded meeting of the Coordinating Council at the Federal State Budgetary Institution "House of the Peoples of Russia" "Public diplomacy: bridges of trust in the era of global challenges", the section "Projects for studying the Russian language abroad and promoting social-significant international initiatives in the field of civil diplomacy", the exhibition "Children draw the world".

### **September 20, Moscow, Russia**



The Panel session "Commonwealth of Independent States: Conscious Unity" was organized within the framework of the World Public Assembly "New World of Conscious Unity". The session discussed issues related to the activities, problems and prospects of the CIS development. The session was moderated by Timur Dzhumurbaev, a member of the Council of the Assembly of People of Kazakhstan, Chairman of the Republican Public Association "Assembly of Zhastars". The panel session was attended by speakers from Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Armenia, Kyrgyzstan, and the Republic of Belarus.

Following the results of the session, a resolution was adopted. The CIS is an influential international organization, the format and methodology of its work are being updated, and the areas in which the association is increasing the volume of interaction between the countries are expanding.

### **September 20, Moscow, Russia**



Within the framework of the First World Public Assembly, a panel session "Latin America — Greater Eurasia: The Era of New Strategic Opportunities" was held, dedicated to the development of new forms of cooperation with Latin America. declaration on the importance of developing direct human communication and friendly relations between countries.

Latin America is a dynamic center of a multipolar world with economic leaders such as Brazil and Mexico. The region has great potential for the development of public diplomacy: civil society institutions and many NGOs are active here, implementing social, humanitarian, educational and cultural projects. This creates a solid foundation for building trust and international relations.

### **September 20, Moscow, Russia**



The Panel session "Africa in the Modern World" was held within the framework of the World Public Assembly.: a new era of cooperation and partnership."

The discussion focuses on the role of public diplomacy in solving urgent problems of humanitarian and economic development of the African continent, considering the unique multinational character of the peoples of African countries and the

cultural diversity of this continent.

The World Peoples Assembly values the vector of its activities in Africa, which includes public organizations and government structures, as well as regional integration associations. 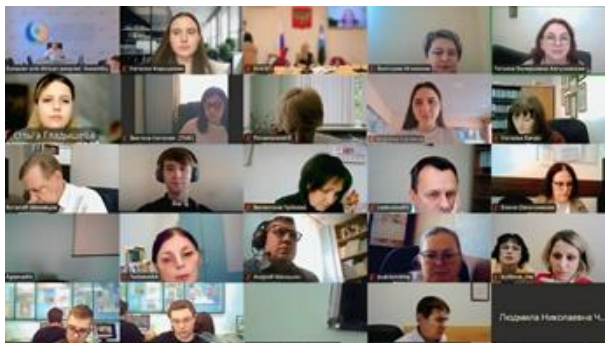

Round Table "International Tourism in a multipolar world". Speakers from Russia, India, Egypt, Kazakhstan, Belarus, and Tajikistan were invited to discuss new areas in the tourism and hospitality industry.

### **October 26-26, Moscow, Russia**

## VII. CULTURAL AND HUMANITARIAN COOPERATION

During the year, the Assembly continued the work to deepen the content of culture as the most important basis for interpersonal relations and the development of society. Special attention was paid to the search for modern forms of popularization of spiritual culture, the affirmation of traditional human values through creative activity and the creation of conditions for partnership in various fields of art. The main areas of work included: support for the cultural traditions of peoples, including their native languages, the development of interreligious cooperation, and the expansion of dialogue between representatives of different nations through cooperation in literature, music, painting, and other creative activities.

Through the joint implementation of the projects "Weddings of the Peoples of the World", "The Eurasian High Fashion Competition of the national costume "ETHNO ERATO", the International art Project "Angels of Peace", the tasks of strengthening spiritual and moral values and preserving the cultural heritage of peoples were solved.

An important task of the year was to strengthen the role and authority of the World Peoples Assembly as a significant institution of public diplomacy, promoting the ideas of humanism, intercultural partnership and the preservation of spiritual heritage. A special place was taken by the preparations for the World Public Assembly "New World of Conscious Unity" to unite representatives of different peoples and cultures in the pursuit of peace, mutual understanding and conscious spiritual development.

Within the World Public Assembly, 10 thematic platforms were organized in the areas of preserving cultural diversity and the intangible heritage of peoples.

### January 24, Russia, Moscow

### **February 7, Manama, Kingdom of Bahrain**



The official opening of the International Festival of Artists in Manama took place. The opening ceremony was attended by representatives of the Department of Culture of the Kingdom of Bahrain and the leadership of the leading universities of the Kingdom of Bahrain. The festival was attended by artists from 27 countries – the Russian Federation, the Kingdom of Bahrain, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, the Sultanate of Oman, Yemen, Syria, Palestine, Lebanon, Iraq, Egypt, Morocco, Mauritania, Tunisia, Algeria, Libya, Sudan, Djibouti, the United States, France, Spain, Malaysia, Indonesia, Philippines, Ukraine. A total of 240 artists, sculptors, ceramists and graphic artists participated. As a sign of gratitude to the Assembly, the festival leaders decided to create a bust of Alexander Pushkin and give it as a gift to the Assembly.

### **February 27, Pakistan, Islamabad, Karachi**



The presentation of the international ethnographic project "Weddings of the peoples of the world: cultural heritage" took place in the cities of Pakistan. The aim of the project is to preserve the unique wedding traditions of the peoples of the world as monuments of intangible cultural heritage. The organizers were the Eurasian and African Peoples' Assembly, the Embassy of the Russian Federation in

Pakistan and the Russian House in Karachi.

The meetings of Deputy Secretary General Stanislav Korolev at the Russian Embassy and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in Islamabad were held at a high level. Interest was expressed in the development of the project and the continuation of further work. The grand opening of the "Weddings of the Peoples of the World" exhibition was held at Nazeer Hussain University in Karachi with the participation of Denis Knyazev, the author of the project, Ruslan Prokhorov, head of the Russian House in Karachi, Farhat Khan, Rector of NHU, Bilal A. Alvi, Vice Rector of NHU, and heads of the university's largest faculties. Within the framework of the cultural mission, a number of meetings were also held with the leadership of the Department of National Heritage and Culture of the Government of Pakistan and the National Commission of Pakistan for UNESCO.

### **March 24, Moscow, Russia**



The celebration of the 26th UNESCO World Poetry Day took place in the Great Hall of the Central House of Writers. The event was organized by the World Organization of Writers (WOW) and the Eurasian and African Peoples' Assembly. Welcoming remarks to the participants and guests were addressed by: Konstantin Kedrov, poet, professor of the Literary Institute, initiator of the celebration of World Poetry Day in Russia since 2000;

Alexandra Ochirova, poet, UNESCO Goodwill Ambassador; Margarita Al, poet, president of the World Organization of Writers WOW, author of the idea of the flash mob; Grigory Ordzhonikidze, His Excellency, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary, Executive Secretary of the Russian Federation Commission for UNESCO; Sergey Khanutin, Executive Director of the Eurasian and African Peoples' Assembly. The event was attended by representatives of embassies and diplomatic missions accredited in Moscow. The evening culminated in the theatrical literary and musical play "A Priori", as well as the international poetic flash mob "Minute of Silence. We are people of the same planet", dedicated to the 80th anniversary of the Great Victory. 300 participants simultaneously read 100 poems about peace in 30 languages of the world for one minute. The poetic action brought together participants from all over Russia: Kalmykia, Bashkiria, Tatarstan, Komi, Udmurtia, Chuvashia, Tuva, Buryatia, Ossetia; as well as guests from Abkhazia, Azerbaijan, Armenia, Belarus, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Brazil, Burkina Faso, Greece, Egypt, India, Indonesia, Iran, Congo, Mongolia, Nepal and other countries. As a result of the flash mob, work has begun on the publication of the international poetry anthology "A Minute of Silence. We are people of the same planet", which will include poems about the world in 30 languages with translation into Russian.

### April 4-17, Moscow, Russia



At the initiative of the Council of Composers and Musical Figures of the Eurasian and African Peoples' Assembly, a series of vocal music concerts "Academic April" has been organized. It includes concerts "Spring is Coming!", "Journey to the Classics" and "Inspiration in every Sound!", which were held in the halls of the Russian National Museum of Music and the Prokofiev Museum. The soloists are students of the creative departments of Moscow universities and colleges, such as the Institute of Contemporary Art, the Academic Music College at the Tchaikovsky Moscow State Conservatory, and the College of the Moscow State Institute of Fine Arts. **World Public Assembly «New World of Conscious Unity»**



**On September 20** a panel session "Spiritual Culture – a space for the formation of meanings and values" was held. The organizers are the Council for Spiritual Culture of the World Peoples Assembly with the support of partners from the International Association "Peace through Culture" (Kazakhstan, Austria), the International Interreligious Community Gobind Sadan (India), the Israeli Society of

Living Ethics and other organizations. The international public Session has become a space for reflection on the role of spirituality in building a harmonious future. International experts from 10 countries, including Austria, Bhutan, Germany, Israel, India, Italy, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, and Russia, reflected on these and other issues of integrating Spiritual Culture into public life. Over the course of two days, 9 thematic platforms were also organized in the direction of preserving cultural diversity and the intangible heritage of peoples.

**On September 20, a round table "Altai – the junction of civilizational worlds"**

moderated by Ivan Belekov, Head of the representative office of the World Peoples Assembly in the Altai Republic was held. The round table was attended by about 50 people from five Eurasian countries: Russia, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan and Greece. The participants discussed the future of the Eurasian partnership. During the discussion, it was emphasized that the fundamental ideological platform for its participants is the dialogue of civilizations, religions and cultures, guided by the fundamental interests of peoples and containing distinctive value and civilization platforms; making an active, fruitful and sustainable contribution to world civilization, to the equality of States, respect for cultural diversity, intercultural interaction and co-creation of peoples. The opinion was supported on the need to create a foundation for the emergence of an updated scientific paradigm in social studies, the creation of the Eurasian Academy of Sciences. The proposal of the Government of the Republic of Kyrgyzstan to hold the International Issyk-Kul Forum in 2026, initiated by Chingiz Torekulovich Aitmatov, was also supported.





**On September 21, a round table and an interactive platform "Ancestral culture: Family-Clan-People-Human race"** were organized. Presentations by experts from Russia, Uzbekistan, Bulgaria, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Spain and Belarus have become a mosaic of a single message: family is more than private life. It is the foundation of identity, the link between the past and the future, between peoples and civilizations. And ancestral culture is the basis for personality formation, the inner moral core, and the stability of family and social ties. In the resolution of the round table, the participants noted that through the connection of family, clan, people and the entire human race, the foundation of respect, responsibility and continuity is laid. By losing it, humanity risks losing itself. By saving it, it will gain a chance for a harmonious future. The continuation of the round table was an interactive program where everyone was able to touch the theme of the Genus: a live exhibition "Ancestral tree" was organized, an interactive game "Genus – the link of generations" was held, and finally everyone lined up in a "Round dance of the genus".



**On September 21 a round table "Interreligious dialogue for the preservation and strengthening of spiritual and moral values" and a panel session "Spiritual Unity for Peace and Humanity"** were held. The platforms provided an opportunity for an open and meaningful dialogue between representatives of different world religions, theological schools, philosophical and social traditions. The purpose of the events was to strengthen interreligious and intercultural dialogue as the basis of sustainable peace, consolidate the efforts of religious and public figures and organizations, and promote spiritual and moral values in the face of modern challenges.

Participants of the event: representatives of various world religions, theological schools, philosophical and social traditions, experts in the field of theology, philosophy and public figures from Russia, South Africa, Germany, Romania, Great Britain, Bhutan and Malaysia exchanged the experience of international organizations in building interreligious dialogue and preserving spiritual and moral values, and also discussed the role of spiritual diplomacy. There are other issues in establishing spiritual guidelines in the world.

## September 20, Moscow, Russia

On September 20-21, the **Second Congress of the World Organization of Writers WOW** was held for two days. The opening of the Second World Congress of Writers was an event that defined a new level of international cultural interaction. Moscow hosted representatives of five continents — poets, philosophers, novelists, translators, cultural researchers, leaders of creative unions and public organizations. 200 participants from 65 countries gathered in the hall. Opening the Second World Congress of Writers, WOW President Margarita Almukhametova conveyed greetings from Nobel Laureate in Literature Wole Shoinka. There were 8 round tables and a panel session "The World Organization of Writers – a catalyst for the spiritual development of civilization" outlined the tasks of the creative union. During the Congress, writers discussed the role of writing communities, the art of translation, book fairs, support for young talents, and other pressing industry issues. One of the most pressing issues in the writing environment is the use of artificial intelligence. The award ceremony for the winners of the WOW World Literary Award took place at the Congress. The award was given to authors who not only demonstrated high skill, but also made a significant contribution to the development of world fiction. Three countries — Brazil, China and Indonesia — have expressed their willingness to take over and host the next WOW congresses in 2026." Many poets and writers were awarded medals and diplomas of the First degree "For their contribution to the development of world literature".

**On September 20-21, the Second Congress of the World Organization of Writers WOW** was held for two days. The opening of the Second World Congress of Writers was an event that defined a new level of international cultural interaction. Moscow hosted representatives of five continents — poets, philosophers, novelists, translators, cultural researchers, leaders of creative unions and public organizations. 200 participants from 65

**On September 20-21, an exhibition of paintings by the International Art Project "Angels of Peace" was held for two days. 120 original paintings by artists from 15 countries were presented. The aim of the project is to promote the development of the socio-cultural space of Eurasia based on the eternal universal values of Love, Gratitude and Unity.**



**On September 20-21, the exhibition "Weddings of the Peoples of the World: World Cultural Heritage" was held for two days. This is an international ethnographic project by photographer Denis Knyazev, implemented with the support of the World Peoples Assembly. It is aimed at preserving unique wedding traditions as monuments of intangible ethnocultural heritage. The exhibition featured 20**



**photographs depicting traditional wedding ceremonies of the peoples of the world: Belarusians, Creoles, Newars, Hindu, Kalbeliya, Maasai, Nenets, Kalmyks, Besermians, Udmurts. The successful implementation of the project connects past and present generations, gives a new impetus to the preservation, development and popularization of the traditional intangible culture of the people.**

### **November 2-3, Omsk, Russia**



The XXIV Eurasian National Costume Haute Couture Competition "Ethno-Erato" was held in a Siberian city. The main goal of "Ethno-Erato" is to demonstrate unique author's collections of national costumes, emphasizing their ethnic identity and diversity in harmony with the trends of modern ethnomoda.

Among the key tasks is the preservation and development of ethno-cultural traditions, family values, as well as support for young talents, providing them with a platform for international cultural cooperation. The organizers of the competition were the regional public organizations Forum of Eurasian Women and Kazakhs of Omsk, as well as the Omsk College of Culture and Art with the support of the Government of the Omsk region. The World Peoples Assembly co-organized the contest, providing information support and preparing a special prize for the finalists "For the preservation of national traditions,

fashion and style." A special diploma and a prize from the Assembly were awarded to a designer from Kazakhstan for a collection of Finno-Ugric costumes. One of the discoveries of this year was the collection of children's clothing. According to the organizers, the designers' interest in this topic will lead to the appearance of a new competition nomination — "The best children's traditional costume."

### **November 6, Krasnoyarsk, Russia**



The IV International Painting and Graphics Contest "Faces of the Angels of the World" named after Yulia Ivanova, which was held from January 25 to April 30 with the support of the World Peoples, has come to an end. Applications were accepted in 5 different categories from amateurs to professionals. 512 works from 288 artists from 13 countries were submitted to the competition: Spain, USA, UAE, China, France and others. The jury selected the

winners in nominations and categories, and the work "Angels over the Volga" won the Grand Prix. The Assembly also sent special diplomas "For assistance to the development of the creative dialogue of the peoples of the world" to the participants of the competition from Belarus, Latvia, the United Arab Emirates, the Pridnestrovian Moldavian Republic, Ukraine, France.

In 2025, the Directorate for the Preservation of Historical Memory of the World Peoples Assembly continued to implement a strategy for the active introduction of modern communication and educational formats aimed at popularizing the memory of the Great Patriotic War. Special attention was paid to digital platforms, multimedia projects and interactive exhibitions, which made it possible to reach a wider audience, including young people and representatives of a generation far from direct experience of war. All the initiatives were synchronized with the anniversary date — the 80th anniversary of the Great Victory, which gave them special significance and international resonance.

The World Peoples Assembly has successfully moved beyond traditional partnerships, involving activists, scientists and cultural figures from Latin America and the Arab world in joint projects.

The activities in 2025 were aimed not only at preserving the past, but also at shaping the future through fostering tolerance, respect for the history of other nations and understanding the value of peace. Anniversary projects have become a catalyst for dialogue between generations and cultures, arguing that the memory of the war can be not only a national, but also a global moral value.



**Film Marathon "Won together"** initiated in 2022, it became an annual year-round companion of the Vladimir Menshov International Film Festival "Won Together". Screenings of the best films of the festival and meetings of students of secondary and higher educational institutions with the authors have become the hallmark of the Assembly's activities.

The film collection "Won Together" has been selected for all ages of viewers and is aimed at fostering love for the Motherland and preserving traditional spiritual and moral values. Respect for work, overcoming circumstances, creating and preserving the truth about the heroic past of the winners – thematic selections are based on the requests of the audience and educational institutions – the sites of the film marathon. Film screenings are accompanied by communication with film authors and specialized teachers.

In 2025, the film marathon was held in educational institutions in Kazan, Chelyabinsk, Novosibirsk, Lugansk, Sochi, Moscow, Khabarovsk, St. Petersburg, and the Rostov region.

On the sidelines of the forum, previously unknown facts and local operations of the Second World War were presented to the general public, anti-fascist movements from different countries were identified, which continue their activities today in the face of total Russophobia and the revival of Nazism and xenophobia. Following the results of the sites for the preservation of historical memory, a number of joint decisions were made to expand activities for the preservation of historical memory.

### November 10 – 17, Russia, Sochi

The 20th Vladimir Menshov International Film Festival "Won Together"

The Film Festival consolidates cinematographers from all over the world who stand for historical truth and defend it in their work. The focus of the festival is on highlighting the victory over fascism during World War II and highlights the facets of human victory in various spheres of life in the present.

Applications from 56 countries were submitted for participation in the festival, films from 45 countries were selected. The authors of a number of films presented them to the audience and took part in daily discussions.

The festival includes 4 competitions: Documentary, National (Russian), TV and streaming, Student – a cross-section of all existing formats of modern documentary cinema. The films were evaluated by professional juries, including famous film and television personalities from Russia, China, Italy, Belarus, Sweden and Brazil.

Special events of the Festival had an international public response: The Round table "Cinema and the image of the future: scenarios for a new world of conscious unity", a meeting of the Council of Heads of State and Public Television and Radio Organizations of the CIS member states, the Program "Lugansk Character" – about world-famous cultural figures of the 20th century – natives of the Russian Lugansk People's Republic.

Important for the professional audience of cinematographers were the programs of the educational courses of the military schools at the VGIK (presented by the famous documentary filmmaker, military commander Valery Tymoshchenko), the program of films from the Arab countries, and the special program "Days of Belarusian Cinema".

The main outcome of the project in 2025 was the signing of a unique document – the "Declaration on Happiness" – at the First World Public Assembly, held on September 20-21 in Moscow. This event brought the topic of happiness to a new stage of development, confirmed its global importance for the preservation of humanity and the establishment of universal well-being.

The further development of the project is inextricably linked to the implementation of the articles adopted in the Declaration. They relate to the most important aspects of human life: the freedom to seek truth and meaning; the unity and integrity of everyone's personality; the immutability of creative self-expression; the right to a conscious pursuit of happiness; the need for a family based on love and mutual respect; the importance of education that educates the mind and heart and forms a high spiritual culture; the importance of social justice; caring for the environment and creating a social environment based on the principles of love, mutual assistance, justice and ecological balance, where the value of an individual is measured by his contribution to the common good.

During the reporting period, the International Creative Festival "The World draws happiness", the project "Happiness of Victory" and the cycle of events "There is Happiness" were actively developing. Work is underway to create and implement new projects that were born after the signing of the Declaration: for example, the International Joy Marathon "Assembly of Happy Nations" and the establishment of the Institute of Happiness Ambassadors.

### September 20 - 21, Moscow, Russia

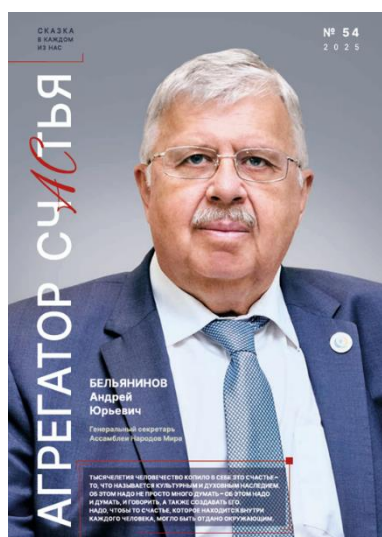


**The International Action "Letters of Happiness"** has become a unique platform that brings together creativity and good wishes from representatives of various peoples of the world.

**September 20 - 21, Moscow, Russia**



A special issue of the Happiness Aggregator magazine was published for the World Public Assembly. In an exclusive interview with the Assembly Secretary General, Andrey Yuryevich Belyaninov, the topic of the conversation was the key concept of true values and the spiritual heritage of mankind, emphasizing the main goal of the World Forum — to unite representatives of different countries and peoples. It translates positive thinking, is aimed at the self-development of readers and improving the quality of life. In an era of information overload and stress, such media becomes especially important for maintaining the psychological health of society. In 2025, 6 issues of the magazine were published.

### III International Creative Festival "The World Draws Happiness"



Exhibitions and presentations of the project will be held, as well as work on its new branches. So, in 2025, two separate directions of the festival were born: "Chocolate Happiness" and "Always be on Top."

The works were received from 1112 participants from the following countries: The People's Republic of China, the

Republic of India, the Republic of Senegal, the Federal Republic of Germany, the Republic of Azerbaijan, the Republic of Tajikistan, the Republic of Uzbekistan, the Republic of South Ossetia, the Russian Federation (the Republic of North Ossetia–Alania), the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Tunisia, Belarus, Turkmenistan, Australia and others. During the year, 9 exhibitions of the project were organized and more than 50 presentations were held.

### **February 4, Russia, Moscow**

Marina Volkova, Head of the Department of Happiness, took part in the International Conference "The Year of Peace and Trust: Development of international activities in the interests of children", dedicated to the 4th anniversary of the establishment of the Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov Charitable Foundation to help children in need of care. The conference was held in the city of Arkadag in Turkmenistan. The event was attended by heads and representatives of government agencies and public

organizations of Uzbekistan, the Republic of Turkey, the Islamic Republic of Iran, the Russian Federation, the Republic of Kazakhstan, the People's Republic of China, Tajikistan, the Republic of Belarus, the Kyrgyz Republic, India, Georgia, Armenia, the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Austria, as well as international organizations. Among the participants of the conference are heads and representatives of ministries and departmental institutions of the country, public organizations, higher educational institutions and mass media.

### April 7, Moscow, Russia

The presentation of the Department of Happiness's projects took place at the grand opening of the X International Youth Festival in the Field of Sustainable Development "VuzEkoFest" at the Peoples' Friendship University of Russia. Representing the World Peoples Assembly as an expert, Marina Volkova evaluated the creative work of the students.

### **April 16, Russia, Moscow**



The projects of the Department of Happiness and the Happiness Aggregator magazine were presented during the Russian International Affairs Council (RIAC), where a round table "Relations between Russia and Qatar in the context of regional and Global Trends" was held. It was organized jointly by the Higher School of Economics and the Center for the Study of International Politics (the State of Qatar).

### **May 28, Moscow, Russia**

The head of the Department of Happiness, M. L. Volkova, made a presentation "The continuity of generations is the key to family happiness and well-being. The experience of the countries of Eurasia and Africa in the formation of family continuity" at the XXIII International Congress "The Russian Family". More than 500 people took part in the Congress. The speakers have repeatedly stressed that youth and young families are the focus of almost all priority national projects.

### **June 4-6, Russia, Kandalaksha**



As part of her working trip to the city of Kandalaksha, Marina Volkova, head of the Department of Happiness, successfully held a number of events: the presentation of the project "There is Happiness", the International Festival "The World draws happiness" and the campaign "Letters of Happiness". The festival became a platform for demonstrating the creativity of children, including from the Murmansk region, and provided them with the opportunity to share their personal understanding of the topic of happiness and joy.

## June 23-25, Russia, Grozny



The head of the Department of Happiness, M. L. Volkova, represented the World Peoples Assembly at the All-Russian Forum with International Participation "Russia - the House of Peoples". The forum actively established friendly relations with representatives of different regions and peoples of Russia, as well as colleagues from other countries; organized a number of events aimed at popularizing the ideas of well-being and happiness among the population; organized an exhibition of the International Creative Festival "The World draws Happiness" within the framework of the forum.; presentation at the section "The Russian language is the basis of the integration dialogue".

## October 11-19

First international marathon of joy "An Assembly of Happy Peoples" was held in online format on October 11 to 19. It gathered participants from more than 20 countries, including Russia, Belarus, Israel, Peru, India, Zambia, USA, Bhutan, Germany, Kazakhstan, Poland, Moldova and Bulgaria. More than 400 people took an active part in it, united by a common goal — to learn the secrets of happiness and share them with each other. The initiative was implemented after the successful round table "Diplomacy of happiness: International practice of building the future", held as part of the First World Public Assembly.

## October 28, Moscow, Russia



At the XIV International Conference of Civil Society Researchers, Marina Volkova, Head of the Department of Happiness of the World Peoples Assembly, made a presentation on the topic at the section "Media, Culture and Public Self-organization": "Shaping a culture of social well-being: the role of civic initiatives and practices in creating an inclusive space of happiness," sharing the Assembly's experience in uniting peoples and organizations from different countries. Marina Leonidovna emphasized the importance of studying the phenomenon of happiness, noting that happiness is the goal of all mankind.

## November, Russia, “Smena” VDC



The All-Russian Children's Center "Smena" hosted the project session "Children of the World" as part of the International Festival of the Russian Language and Russian Culture. About 200 schoolchildren who came for an international shift took part in the event. At the end of the session, each of the 15 teams presented their project plan and proved its relevance. Among the ideas they proposed

was the creation of an application with educational content about the cultural heritage of different nations. The festival program was implemented with the support of the Ministry of Education of the Russian Federation, the My Story Foundation for the Humanities, Armavir State Pedagogical University, the Interstate Union of Hero Cities and the World Peoples Assembly.

### The Happy Sails Project

The project's events took place throughout the year in Crimea. In particular, they got acquainted with the project, the sailing regatta, which was attended by about 720 people from Russia, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Abkhazia and Belarus.



### The Happiness to Fly project

During the year, together with the Flow Moscow Sports and Entertainment Complex in Lublino, flights were conducted in an air tube. From June to August, delta flights were also operated.



## VIII. YOUTH AND CHILDREN'S COOPERATION

In 2025, the key outcome of the activities of the Youth World Peoples Assembly was the successful holding of the International Youth Forum "Generation of Unity", which brought together representatives of youth organizations and social movements from more than 25 countries. The Forum became an important part of the World Public Assembly "New World of Conscious Unity" and demonstrated the high organizational and coordination ability of the participating parties. The Resolution, developed within the framework of four strategic sessions of the International Youth Forum and unanimously supported by the participants, defined the areas of youth cooperation in diplomacy, digital technologies, education, science and culture for the future until 2030.

An important area of work was the formation of a large multifunctional volunteer team of about 300 people.

In addition, five cooperation agreements were signed with international and national youth organizations during the year, which consolidated the established partnerships and expanded the international network of interaction.

### March 19, Russia, Saint Petersburg



The Assembly's Sustainable Development Directorate held an international round table "Youth Initiatives". Members of the St. Petersburg Youth Parliament spoke about the activities of their councils, ongoing projects, including "Arctic Tourist Routes" and business lectures.

Scientific research conducted by the Councils was of particular interest. The International Round Table was attended by Chairman of the Board of the Foundation for Entrepreneurship Support in Central Asia S.I. Krents and Director General of the BRICS International Development Organization I.V. Fomin.

### March 15, Moscow, Russia



The BRICS+ Media Center hosted an international interactive discussion "Eco-habits: the Past and Present are closer than they seem" by the Assembly's Directorate for Sustainable Development. During the meeting, the participants discussed how an eco-friendly lifestyle was formed in the

past and which habits are easy to implement today. The event was attended by representatives of the International Development Organization BRICS Youth Council and the Art of Living Together student Club MATU MASI.

### March 24, Moscow, Russia



Moscow hosted a meeting of the leaders and members of the International Development Organization BRICS Youth Council and the Directorate of Sustainable Development of the Eurasian and African Peoples Assembly with the youth community from Nigeria. As a result of the game, students gain practical experience working in a team, learn to present their ideas in a reasoned manner and find compromises.

### **April 18, Tashkent, Uzbekistan**

The Forum included the Official Opening and the plenary session "Generation of

Unity: Youth in a world of global Challenges"; Four strategic areas of the session:

- "The future of diplomacy: the role of youth and social responsibility";
- "Digital media and information literacy: people, society, AI";
- "Education and science — new horizons of development";
- "Culture and interethnic dialogue — bridges between generations."



The work topics included:

SWOT analysis, master groups, project workshops; Debates and the World Café format; Case studies on digital culture and media literacy; preparation of project initiatives.

Following the sessions, international youth initiatives were put forward and considered, which were subsequently included in the final resolution of the forum.

### **September 21, Moscow, Russia**
